The Ringwood Spiders football club competes in the Football Integration Development Association (FIDA). FIDA was implemented to provide an Australian Rules football program for people in Victoria with mild to medium intellectual disabilities and has been successfully run since the early 1990s.

'To provide people with a disability an opportunity to interact, participate and build social skills and leadership within the community'



Since 1992 the Ringwood Spiders (formally Ringwood Blues) have provided football opportunities for people with a disability within the City of Maroondah and surrounding areas. Our club has a strong position and history associated with the outer eastern suburbs of Melbourne and continues to provide football

and recreation participation opportunities for people with a disability within our local community. The club has forged a long term relationship with the Maroondah City Council and other key local Recreation and Disability organisations and thank them for their support.

In addition to the FIDA football program, this year the club has continued its Cheerleader Squad and Junior Development squad, both of which will continue to grow and increase the participation of people with a disability in community grass roots sport and recreation programs.
