Ringwood Spiders (Blues): 20 Years

The Ringwood Spiders football club competes in the Football Integration Development Association (FIDA). FIDA was implemented to provide an Australian Rules football program for people in Victoria with mild to medium intellectual disabilities and has been successfully run

since the early 1990s. This year we celebrate 20 years. Since 1992, when we were known as the Ringwood Blues, we have provided football opportunities for people with a disability within the City of Maroondah and surrounding areas.

Several players are still with us from 1992: Adam and Jeremy who are still playing, Greg now our runner and



Frank who started it all and is still an active committee member. We have a strong position and history associated with the outer eastern suburbs of Melbourne and have held a strong relationship with the Maroondah City Council since day one, shown tonight by the attendance of four Councillors. We sincerely thank them for their support.



We have grown over the last 20 years, and as we enter our 21st year in 2012, we are just as committed to further develop the participation opportunities for people with a disability in community grass roots sport and recreation programs as our forebears were in 1992.

2011 Highlights

Mental Health Awareness Forum

2011 saw the Spiders host a Mental Health Awareness Forum in partnership with the City of Maroondah and with support from Beyond Blue and Eastern Access Community Health.



Three of Victoria's leading experts in mental health addressed the Forum which aimed to provide practical information and raise awareness of mental illness. The forum was held in June at Ringwood's Karalyka Centre with more than 90 community residents, club supporters and families in attendance. Guest speakers included;

- Associate Professor Jane Burns from Melbourne University (ORYGEN Youth Health & Inspire Foundation)
- Mr. John McGrath AM, Deputy Chairman of Beyond Blue who has also experienced the effects of depression first-hand
- # Ms. Sharon Boag from Eastern Access Community Health (EACH) (Lifeworks)

The night was a great success and we have had much feedback since on the good work of attendees spreading the word on the help that is available to people suffering mental illnesses such as depression. EFL Umpires and Home Games

We are the envy of the FIDA competition in being able to provide umpires of the highest level at our home games. This is due to the fantastic support we receive from the EFL Umpires Association and the umpires who give up their Sunday morning to umpire our games.

The EFL umpires bring a level of professionalism rarely



seen at this level of competition and it helps the players appreciate and learn respect for the umpires. After each game, the two field umpires presented an award to the player judged best on ground; the winner receiving the match-day football. This year, Daynah, Dani and Sean were recipients. Thanks to Trevor Finch and all the umpires.

At our home games we are very lucky to have the scoreboard operating; something that rarely occurs in FIDA games. This is made possible with the help of Kelvin Snooks and Terry Wynne and we thank them along with Shane Dawson and Michael Baldwin who are always on hand to assist with goal umpiring; your help is appreciated.

Spiders Preseason Activities

This year, we included a few different activities to the usual training sessions.

First up, a ride along the Lilydale-Warburton rail trail: In cool, but ideal riding conditions, the group set off from Lilydale for the long and steady uphill climb to Mt Evelyn before enjoying the long downhill run to Wandin and on to the relatively flat trail to Warburton. It wasn't too long though before some discovered this was going to be a bit



more than a short trip around to a mates' place, but they persisted admirably. A few riders joined 'the peleton' at Yarra Junction to complete the journey to Warburton where the backside-sore and weary riders were welcomed by sunny blue skies and the support crew, who put on a



welcome lunch of hearty salad rolls and a wonderful fruit platter.

The experience was a great success for all participants, as it pushed their limits and hopefully imparted some knowledge about the importance of preparation and pacing oneself. It was encouraging to see the team work through and overcome mental barriers and challenges to achieve a specific goal.



Next up a different challenge - The 1000 steps: This venue is a very popular destination for those wanting a challenge, or who are in training for greater journeys. Starting at Ferntree Gully National Park, a group of Spiders players and Adam, our Cheerleader captain, set off for the climb to One Tree Hill. Although it was incredibly busy, the boys made it to the top in good time; they did so well in fact

we continued the journey for an extra kilometre or two through the One Tree Hill forest.

All Abilities Cricket Carnival:

For the second year, we entered a team in the Cricket Victoria All-abilities Cricket Carnival held at Casey Fields in Cranbourne. Unfortunately, the day was cut short due to the inclement weather, but we did get one game in. It was especially pleasing to see Jordan Wynne and Sean Harris selected for the State Team, which is a great honour.



Olympic Gold and Silver

Spiders player Raymond Scott recently travelled to Athens to compete in the Special Olympics World Games. Raymond's chosen discipline is tenpin bowling, which he has been playing for most of his life, and he came away with two silver medals and one gold medal, a fantastic achievement. The result is all the more impressive as he broke his arm (non-bowling side luckily) not long before leaving. Congratulations Raymond!



Lakeside Café Junior Development Squad

Our Junior Development Squad fills a void for children aged between 8 and 14-16. This group generally may have participated in an Auskick program, or they may just love footy but might not want, or be able to participate in main-stream programs.
